	The Chairman welcomed all those present to the MacDonald Aviemore Highland Resort Hotel.				
	Minutes of AGM 8 th March 2018				
	The Minutes were proposed by Col. Bewsher and seconded by Lynda Campbell as a true record of the meeting.				
3.	hairman's Report

4.	Financial Report				
	Finlay Clark reported on the Management Accounts of the Association of Deer Management Groups to 28 th February 2018.				
	 Against an income budget of £81,000 relating to membership subscriptions some £78,800 had been recovered. This is against a total annual budget of £108,600. FC summarised the areas of income, as donations received, lunch recoveries, associate membership subscriptions, newsletter advertising, bank interest and miscellaneous. 				
	 Year to date actual income was £82,821 versus a budget of £88,546 there was therefore a shortfall of £5,725 against budget. 				

	 FC reported that the total income budget for the year to 30th June 2018 was £117,244 and was confident that the income budget would be achieved. On expenditure to 28th February 2018, the only area of expenditure at variance with budget related to regional meetings, running some £305 over 			
	 budget. Against a budgeted spend of £72,720 an actual spend of £42,342 had occurred. There was therefore a positive variance of some £24,653 year-to-date. 			
	 FC reported that the budget surplus to the 30th June 2018 of £1,054 was likely to be achieved or exceeded by the year end. FC reported that the Association held £114,540 cash in the bank as at the 28th February 2018. 			
	FC reported on the audited accounts of the ADMG income and expenditure account for the year ending June 2017.			
	 FC reported the total income to the year ending 30th June 2017 as £127,529.19. Subscriptions totalling £90,871.15 had been recovered along with a significant level of donations received through donors amounting to £35,150. 			
	 Expenditure totalling £85,485.08 was incurred and comprised of administration totalling £39,107.34 and other major costs included PR, Consultants' fees and £12,783 and various DMG project costs amounting to £10,610.17 which accounted for Linzi Seivwright and Victor Clements in the main. 			
	 A net surplus of £42,044.01 was recorded. Debtors and cash in bank accounted for £130,921.71 and creditors amounted to £84,343.40. Net assets recorded at £126,578.31. 			
	The annual accounts and financial statements for the year ending 30 th June 2017 had been audited by Johnson Carmichael and signed by the Chairman of the Association, Richard Cooke on 13 th February 2018.			
	There were no questions in relation to the Management Accounts.or Audited Accounts to the end of June 2017.			
	Proposed by Duncan Gordon and seconded by Alistair Gibson.			
5.	Chairman and Executive Committee Elections			
	Richard Cooke stated that, in terms of the Constitution, the position of Chair was not due for election in 2018, he having been re-elected in 2017. However the position of Vice-Chair falls due and Randal Wilson had indicated that he would not offer himslelf			
	for re-election. The Chairman thanked Randal for his work during the two years that he had served as vice chairman and proposed Tom Turnbull, former Chairman of Inverary and Tyndrum DMG as the new Vice Chairman; seconded by Mike Luti. There were no further nominations and Mr Turnbull was therefore duly elected Vice Chairman.			
	Areas 2, 4, 6 and 7			
	The Chairman thanked David Allison who wished to stand down, for his work in representing Area 1 and proposed Tom Chetwynd as his successor; seconded by Niall Rowantree.			

	The Chairman proposed that all other office bearers be confirmed en-bloc, seconded by Falcon Frost.

	An update was requested regarding North Lorne and Kintyre. Tom Turnbull had been encouraging engagement and progress was on-going in the area which is largely forestry. Winston Churchill confirmed that work had restarted around 18 months previously and progress was being made. Linzi Seivwright was in the process of putting a DMP together.

	Col. Bewsher advised that Food Standards Scotland (FSS) had reported there had been instances of wilful non compliance with food hygiene legislation at inspected processor premises and that FSS must be taken very seriously. This message was reinforced by the Chairman. It was noted that the food safety message must be disseminated more widely. The consequences of food poisoning from infected meat can be fatal and the message should be "if in doubt, throw it out". FSS had set up a hotline to encourage the industry to report unsafe practices and to promote self- regulation. The FSS hotline number is: 0800 028 7926

	SNH was working with ADMG to clarify the criteria for the 2019 Assessments to ensure the deer sector know what to expect and that there are no surprises but that the process will be based on the same 101 criteria as used in the 2016 review.				
	CR relayed Angus Campbell's and Sue Walker's apologies for their absence from the meeting. SW would be stepping down as Deputy Chair of SNH and AC would be succeeding her and also taking over as Chair of the Deer Management Round Table.				
	SNH's CEO, Francesca Osowska was undertaking a cycle ride around the country and meeting many stakeholders. ADMG had now had two good meetings with her including her attendance at a DMG meeting.				

Current SNH Projects included:

Independent Deer Working Group - secretariat and support;

Lowland Deer Panel - technical support and secretariat;

-: now working towards 2019 which includes Lowlands as well as Uplands;

Deer vehicle collisions;

Funding - increase to £500,000 on projects and increase in staff. £200,000 support to DMGs including HIA and cull reductions, £30,000 to Best Practice;

Regulatory powers – had been reviewed and it was intended to utilise these more rigorously. CR also said that SNH will use the new powers under Section 6A of the land Reform (Scotland) Act. There is a determination to use powers and adopt a more assertive approach in supporting and guiding the deer sector;

Willie Fraser, Helen MacIntyre and Robbie Rowntree had made excellent presentations to DMRT. In summary CR said that 2017/18 had been a busy year and SNH were now preparing for DMG reassessments in 2019 and putting more time in to lowland deer matters.

The Cabinet Secretary was focused on delivery of the public interest and CR was happy that good progress is being made with the deer sector being well placed for the 2019 review;

RMJC stressed the need for close working with SNH. There were many high performing DMGs, but there were a few Groups where more work is required to demonstrate that the deer sector had the capacity to deliver under the voluntary principle.

Questions:

RMJC said that FES is most supportive of DMGs and plays a key part and positive role in the deer sector. Local Authorities were now more active in deer management and were engaging in DMGs and Lowland Deer Groups.

CR was asked for SNH's view on FSS and the standard of deer larders and handling. CR acknowledged concerns but had nothing particular to add other than that SNH will provide support where possible.

10. Questions

Peter Mayhew was asked about food production in the uplands and the future of upland farms. PM responded that the Government was focused on integrated land use which includes sheep and cattle farming. The consequences of Brexit are unpredictable, but changes in the global economy also affects agricultural output disproportionately and the agricultural sector was more challenging than ever.

PM was asked whether there was monetary value in Natural Capital, does it exist and what does it look like? How is it quantified?

PM commented that Scottish Government policies were not always coordinated. Monetising Natural Capital is difficult and potentially misleading. Economic decisions must quantify National Capital to enable balanced decision making.

Claudia Rowse spoke of the National Capital Index which could produce a natural capital account for Scotland. At local level. SNH was liaising with CES regarding a natural capital protocol and how this relates to land management and delivery of public benefit.

RMJC commented that Natural Capital value would take stewardship into account which is very important.

11. AOB

David Allison advised that he was recruiting staff from Ultimate OE based in New Zealand. RMJC has contact details and encouraged any DMGs needing staff to let ADMG know. The potential for student / scholarship exchange was to be explored.

ADMG are to carry out a stalking rent survey sponsored by Knight Frank.

There being no other business the Chairman thanked all those in attendance and closed the meeting.
