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It's been a tough year

- Challenges from Covid across entire food and drink sector
- Market was growing pre-Covid (retail growth at almost 12% -Kantar)
- Closure of hotel, restaurant, catering, events, food service
- Drop in price paid to producers
- Some producers have adapted
- Exports challenged



SVA Finance

- SVA spend per annum just £20K
- SVA income is less and reducing
- Reduced cull means reduced levy (2p/kg)
- Only two processors collect the levy
- Additional financial support from Highland Game and deer farmers (through First Venison)



Information

- SVA needs to know the facts to represent sector case to Government
- Producers provide good information – good response to Covid impact survey (May 2020)
- Information from processors and AGHEs is sparse. Lack of engagement an issue



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- Unlocking the local supply chain
- Greenhouse gas emissions research
- Country Food Trust

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Minister Nicola Sturgeon has now nfirmed that the mainland – with the exception of Moray – will move to Level 2 from 17 May which will relax rules around socialising indoors, hospitality and entertainment venues like cinemas.
